

It can be an excellent career to have when you are older, as it is very varied and interesting, flexible and well-paid.

 How would you describe their style and what do you like or admire about it? (Is it realistic, humorous, cartoon style, sketchy, stylised, fantastical...?)

 What materials or media do they use? (Is it digital, collage, drawn, painted, stitched...?)



Create some pieces of art in the style of one or more of your favourite illustrators.

- Copy an illustration they did, or a detail from one what is easy or hard about their style?
- Draw an illustration for a favourite scene from a book in their style.
- Choose an illustration by one artist, and recreate it in the style of another!
- Make a diorama of a favourite scene in a book.
