Climate Change


The earliest humans, Homo habilis, lived. They used simple stone tools and developed into Homo Sapiens. The end of this era was the Ice Age.

> Mesolithic Era (Middle Stone Age) 8800 BC - 4500 BC Hunter Gatherers

Key Vocabulary

Hominid –The family of mankind and his or her relatives Homo habilis - The earliest version of man who lived approximately 2.1 million years ago.

Homo sapian – the modern version of man that was first discovered approximately 300,000 years ago.

Lucy — the earliest hominid skeleton found.

Hunter-Gatherer – A person who meets their needs by hunting animals and gathering plants.

Nomad – A person who has no fixed home and moves around from place to place.

Flint -A type of stone used to make tools and weapons.

Flaking – A process of shaping stone by chipping pieces off the edges

BC - Stands for 'before Christ' and is used for years before the estimated birth of Jesus.

Ice age — a period of time when the world covered by sheets of ice

Prehistoric – a time before written records existed.

Lascaux - The place in France where the first cave painting were found.

Round house - circular dwellings that are made of wooden or stone posts - filled in with wattle-and-daub (a mixture of twigs, earth and clay), and a thatched roof.
