Key Vocabulary	
River Nile	A river in Africa, which flows 6,695 km.
River Thames	A 346 km river, which runs through the city of London.
Canal	Man-made water channels for flow, vehicles and irrigation.
Irrigation/	Supply of water to land and crops to help growth.
Settlement	A place where a group of people establish a community.
Floodplain	Flat area around a river that often gets flooded.
Delta⁄	A landform at the mouth of the river, allowing it to flow in to an ocean.
Source	The starting point of a river
Human features	Focuses on human activity and its effects e.g. population.
Physical features	Deals with natural factors e.g. land
Tourism⁄	People travelling for fun.
Fertile	Good soil/land, able to produce lots of crops.
