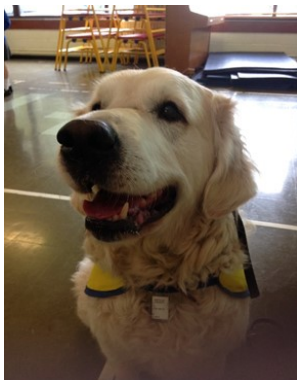
Safety and Wellbeing
